Reference: City of Lexington's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration, as follows:

Sec. 2-28. - Compensation of mayor and members of city council.

As compensation for their services, each member of council and the mayor shall be paid a salary established by action of the city council.

ESTABLISHMENT

LEXINGTON CITY CODE

ARTICLE V. ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS GENERALLY*

Sec. 2-121. - Membership and appointment; terms and vacancies.

(a) Members of advisory boards and commissions shall be appointed by the city council for terms of three (3) years, except as otherwise provided by law or ordinance to expire as of the second Monday in December. All members of advisory boards and commissions shall be residents of the city, except as otherwise provided in bylaws or specific requirements for certain advisory boards or commissions. Members shall be persons of commitment and prestige, representing a cross section of the community including the racial, religious, business, labor and civic elements.

(b) Members of advisory boards and commissions shall hold office until their successors are appointed and qualified. Any vacancy arising from a cause other than expiration of term shall be filled only for the unexpired portion of the term. It shall be unlawful for any member to serve for more than two (2) consecutive full terms, without an intervening period of three (3) years, and appointment for the unexpired portion of a term shall not be considered an appointment for the full term. It is in the best interest of the city that no appointed individual serve on more than one (1) advisory board or commission at any given time. (Res. 51-87, 11-23-87)

Sec. 2-122. - Compensation.

Members of advisory boards and commissions shall serve without compensation unless otherwise approved by the city council.

Sec. 2-123. - Officers.

Every advisory board or commission shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from its members, and shall elect a secretary, who may be either a member or an employee of the city.

Sec. 2-124. - Regular meetings.

Advisory boards and commissions shall hold meetings regularly at least once each month, unless there is not sufficient business to warrant a meeting, but not more than ninety (90) days shall expire without a regular or special meeting. Regular meetings shall be held on the days and at the hours as may be fixed by rule of the board or commission.

Sec. 2-125. - Special meetings.

Special meetings of advisory boards or commissions may be called by the chairman; provided, that each member shall be notified personally at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the time fixed for the meeting.

Sec. 2-126. - Rules and regulations for discharge of duties; minutes.

Each advisory board or commission may adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary for the proper discharge of its duties, which shall be filed with the city clerk. A full account of all meetings shall be faithfully recorded in a minute book to be kept by the secretary.

Sec. 2-127. - Place of meetings; all meetings to be public and accommodating.

All regular and special meetings of advisory boards or commissions shall be held at a specified facility or assembly area that meets all ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements. All such meetings shall be open to the public, in accordance with the provisions of the Open Meetings Law, G.S. § 143-318.10. Any member of the public who needs an accommodation to participate in the meeting should notify the city manager or city clerk at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting or contact Relay North Carolina.

Sec. 2-128. - Quorum and vote required for recommendation.

A simple majority of the total number of members of any advisory board or commission shall constitute a quorum, but the concurrence of at least a majority of the total number of members shall be required before any recommendation is made on any matter considered.

Sec. 2-129. - Expenditures.

It shall be unlawful for any advisory board or commission to make expenditures or contract any indebtedness for which the city shall be liable, without the approval of the council.

Sec. 2-130. - Reports to council.

Upon request by council, with sufficient notification, each advisory board or commission shall make a report of its activities, accomplishments and goals to council.

Sec. 2-131. - Removal of members.

A member of an advisory board or commission may be removed by the council for cause. If a member shall be absent for three (3) consecutive meetings without an excuse granted by the board or commission, this may be considered as cause for removal.

Sec. 2-132. - Private interest of members.

It shall be unlawful for any member of an advisory board or commission to propose, advocate or vote on any matter in which he/she has a separate, private or monetary interest, either direct or indirect.

LEXINGTON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

On March 23, 2015, City Council adopted Ordinance No. 15-28 merging the duties of the Lexington Historic Preservation Commission with the Lexington Planning Board in accordance with NCGS 160A-400.7, which allows municipalities this authority contingent upon at least three members of the combined board having a special interest, experience or education in history architecture, archaeology or related fields. Members of Lexington Planning Board and Board of Adjustment may serve two consecutive three-year terms. Each Councilor representing a ward will appoint a representative from each of their respective City voting wards, unless the historic preservation board member requirement must be fulfilled; which in that case, the Councilor will have the authority to choose a “qualifying” member from across the City instead of a ward resident to fill the vacancy. Two Board of Adjustment members are designated by the Mayor to serve as alternates for one year. Meetings are held the third Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, 28 West Center Street, Lexington, North Carolina. (All addresses are Lexington, C)
